Alongside creation care

Around the world, Alongside Hope's partners are working to restore the land that has been ravaged by climate change. They provide training and tools to farmers so that they can adopt nature-positive agricultural techniques such as water conservation and organic fertilizer. Partners also work to provide communities with clean water and improve access, including through the construction of shallow wells that use solar-powered pumps. They are teaching young people the importance of protecting the environment, and how to spread the word on local radio stations and other media. And they are encouraging Indigenous and rural communities to advocate for their local needs in protection of their ecosystems, such as ending deforestation and mining.
