As the effects of climate change intensify, summer heat waves are leading to increased risk of destructive wildfires in Canada. In 2023, wildfires destroyed six times as many hectares as compared to 2001. Hurricanes and tropical storms have also become more frequent and more harmful. Churches are often in an ideal position to respond to medium- and long-term needs of the community. Through our emergency response efforts, Alongside Hope is there to help. Past responses have included emergency funds and trauma recovery in British Columbia, Yukon, Alberta, Nova Scotia and more. In times of emergency, parishes are encouraged to work with their diocese or spiritual ministry to apply for an emergency grant.
