In the Tzeltal Indigenous Communities of Mexico, the Weaving Strength for Good Living project focuses on strengthening local capacities, promoting gender equality and improving food security.

In the past year, the project has helped 375 families achieve improved food security, with half of them becoming self-sufficient in producing grain, vegetables and fruit. Families have adopted sustainable garden practices, such as organic composting, foliar fertilizers and pest control, which have benefited their land, health and income.

The project has also equipped 30 women to improve their personal and economic empowerment, inspiring 150 other community members to follow suit. Young men have joined the initiative, fostering intergenerational exchange and leadership development. As a result, women are taking the lead in food production, ensuring their families' well-being and strengthening their communities.



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
