The Mi'kmaewey Debert Cultural Centre (MDCC) is beginning an historic journey to reclaim the Mi'kmaq Nation's cultural heritage in Nova Scotia. For centuries, the Mi'kmaq people faced cultural displacement, with their artifacts and treasures taken from them. Now, a significant collection of Mi'kmaq artifacts are being brought home from the National Museum of the American Indian in Washington, D.C.

This repatriation is a crucial step in reconciliation for Canada and healing for the Mi'kmaq Nation. The returned collection will equip future generations to connect with their heritage, strengthening their connection to their heritage and ancestral roots. The MDCC's work inspires Indigenous communities across Canada, promoting cultural revitalization and reconciliation.

As the Mi'kmaq Nation reclaims its past, it paves the way for a brighter future. The MDCC's efforts ensure that the stories, traditions, and history of the Mi'kmaq people will be preserved and celebrated for generations of Canadians to come.
